





Initial Difficulties faced by IB students

- Lecture based classes with no discussions
- Concentrating in big classrooms with many students
- Writing reports in Japanese
- Understanding technical terms in Japanese
- Not allowed to use an electronic dictionary
- ► Lack of communication and discussion with teacher
- Club activities are too stressful

IB Student reasons for choosing Okayama University

- 1. Does not require the National Center Test
- 2. Recognizes the IB diploma without imposing any other tests
- 3. Can apply to most faculties with documents only
- 4. Offers Spring and Fall admissions
- 5. Can apply to all faculties with an IB score of 24*
- 6. National University with low tuition fees; global image
- 7. Overall cost of living in Okayama is cheap
- 8. Near to my/parents hometown
- 9. Strongly recommended by IB student Advisors/ Parents
- 10. Many opportunities to study abroad

*Except the 6-year Medical School Course which requires an IB Diploma Score of 39

Survey on IB Admission

Survey Method:

20 College Counselors from International Schools and First Article schools in Japan, were asked to fill out a survey anonymously, with the following questions.

a) What are your expectations of Japanese National Universities?

b) What are some disappointing aspects of Admission policies at Japanese National Universities?

c) What are your suggestions for improving the existing Admission policies?

- d) What are the reasons behind IB students choosing Foreign Universities over Japanese Universities?
- e) What are the reasons behind IB students choosing Private Universities over National Universities in Japan?

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Results of Survey

- 1. Lack of understanding of the IB education system.
- 2. Unrealistic expectations of IB students
- 3. Unfamiliarity with overseas admission policies with regard to age at admission, language requirements, IB credit transfers.
- 4. Not recognizing the IB Diploma and imposing admission tests.
- 5. Japanese Private Universities providing offers similar to overseas Universities are given priority over Japanese National Universities, irrespective of the high costs involved.

Conclusion from Survey Results

- 1. Multiple approaches are necessary by Japanese Universities to accommodate IB students.
- 2. Balancing the needs of IB students with the expectations of University teachers is very important.
- 3. Further surveys and interviews depicting a realistic picture are necessary in order to create an IB friendly Japanese University

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
