

4. Japanese Placement Test

- (1) Those who are taking Japanese language courses at Okayama University for the first time and those who have experience studying the Japanese language should be sure to take the Japanese placement test before registering. The Japanese placement test can be taken online from Japan or overseas. Students are encouraged to take the test as soon as possible.

- (2) After taking the test, you must fill out the application form and submit your score report attaching the PDF file on it.
The form used will vary depending on your enrollment status at Okayama University.
 - 1) Undergraduate students:
Global Discovery Program (GDP), EPOK, Japanese Studies Students, students of other overseas study programs

- (3) In principle, students should select and register for classes that they wish to take from among the Japanese language classes at the level determined by their test results. If you register for a class that does not match your level, your credits will not be recognized.

- (4) Japanese placement test results from prior to registration for Term 1 are valid for Term 1 and Term 2 registration. Japanese placement test results from prior to registration for Term 3 are valid for Term 3 and Term 4 registration. However, test results from two months or longer before registration are invalid.
